Barnwood Halt by Barnwood Model Railway Club 4mm OO gauge

This layout aims to allow the younger audience members to drive a selection of 0-4-0 driven passenger and freight stock.

Hilton MOD by Phil Harries and Barnhill MRC 4mm OO gauge

The Hilton branch serves an MOD facility, and includes a locomotive maintenance depot.

Glb Bitterfeld by Eric Bird 3.5mm HO gauge

A German permanent way rolling stock maintenance depot, featuring working heavy lift cranes, tampers, snow clearing vehicles and small track maintenance machines.

Hillside Exchange by David Griffin 4mm P4/OO9 gauge

Interchange between standard and narrow gauge preserved lines, a mixed gauge layout of 009 and P4 standards that shows a preserved narrow gauge line interacting with a standard gauge Heritage Railway

St Wick by Alex Hodges 2mm N gauge

A two-platform station and a small locomotive servicing shed, set in 1980s and 1990s.

Vine Street by Chris Sharp 2mm N gauge

Vine Street is a busy urban end to end terminus layout based on the late Cyril Freezer's "Minories" plan. DCC with wire in tube point control.

"Gloucester Remembered" by Mike Joyner

Take yourself back to the glory days of Horton Road with "Gloucester" locos
