Barnwood Halt by Barnwood Model Railway Club 4mm OO gauge

Double Track Inner and Outer Loop. Outer loop is spectator driven. With two stations and village scene.

Honeycombe Leaze by John Thomas 3mm TT gauge

Kings Lane by Freddie Papper 4mm OO gauge

King's Lane is a micro shunting puzzle layout in OO gauge. It has a small station, fuelling point and engine shed. It is fully lit so can

simulate night running. The design has been left deliberately generic so that a range of stock can be used to represent different regions or eras.

Ashton Meadows by Clevedon Armchair Modellers 4mm OO gauge

Ashton Meadows is a small BR engineer's depot, based loosely on the Ashton Meadows, and anyone familiar with the depot will recognise the buildings. The layout operates as a shunting puzzle.

Main Hall

Aimford End by Amelia Chamberlain 4mm OO gauge

A fictitious terminus of a branch line in the Cotswolds around the 1950s/60s in the western region

A Remote Depot by Jeff Pike 4mm EM gauge

Ballast loading depot with RC vehicles to load wagons.

Orchard Road TMD by Gary Lane 4mm OO gauge

A diesel depot layout based loosely on a fictional Devon location during the BR blue era. The depot is used for minor servicing and refuelling, and locomotives typically seen in the South West may be seen moving on and off shed

Porthmawgan Yard by Paul Hodges 4mm OO gauge

Porthmawgan Yard is a fictitious location in North Cornwall served by both S.R and GW services in BR days (1950's / 1960's)

Fryupdale Brewery by Nigel Hawkes 4mm EM gauge

A small brewery layout. Locomotives are mainly industrial, though there are some ex mainline locomotives to be seen

Bristol Harbour by Bob Edwardes 4mm OO gauge

Featuring Stothert & Pitt Dockside 3 Ton Electric Cranes (originals located at MShed Museum, Bristol)

Summer on Sodor by Hucclecote Railway Modellers **4mm 00 gauge**

Displaying a variety of locos from the "Thomas the Tank Engine" books, and inviting you to take the controls.
